**BP AND EVA ROWE REACH SETTLEMENT WITH BP
IN TEXAS CITY REFINERY EXPLOSION LAWSUIT**

Agreement to aid education, health care and worker training and safety

Galveston, TX – (November, 9, 2006) – BP, Eva Rowe and her attorney Brent Coon, Brent Coon & Associates, announced today they had reached a settlement in Miss Rowe's lawsuit over the death of her parents, James and Linda Rowe, in the BP oil refinery explosion in Texas City, Texas, on March 23, 2005.

The settlement called for the release of seven million pages of sealed corporate documents that would have been presented during trial. Without the efforts of Mr. Coon in achieving this agreement, those documents would never been released into the public domain and complete justice would not have been achieved.

The settlement also mandated that at least \$30 million in charitable donations be made to three foundations and \$1 million each to St. Jude's Children's Hospital and to create a college scholarship foundation for the Hornbeck, Louisiana school district. Linda Rowe taught at Hornbeck High school before working at the BP Texas City plant. Ms. Rowe also received an undisclosed financial settlement. The three foundation donations were:

- A \$12.5 million donation to the Texas A&M University Mary Kay O'Connor Process Safety Center, in memory of all 15 people who died in the Texas City explosion. The Center was established in 1995 in memory of Ms. O'Connor who was an engineer killed in a Texas City refinery explosion. Ms. Rowe selected the O'Connor Center to help further its work in improving refinery safety.
- A \$12.5 million donation to the University of Texas Medical Branch at Galveston, Truman G. Blocker Adult Burn Unit, in memory of all 15 people who died in the Texas City explosion. Victims of the explosion were treated at this facility.
- A \$5 million donation to The College of the Mainland, in Texas City, for safety and process technology training for refinery and chemical plant workers, in memory of all 15 people who died in the Texas City explosion. Ms. Rowe wanted to promote education and training of students seeking careers in refinery and chemical plant safety and process technology.
- In addition, BP agreed to match up to \$2 million each for any donations made by individuals during the subsequent six months to Texas A&M, UTMB or College of the Mainland programs, a potential \$6 million in additional donations. .
- A payment will also be made to Miss Rowe, but that figure will not be disclosed.

**BRENT COON & ASSOCIATES WINS MULTI-MILLION DOLLAR LAWSUIT
AGAINST PFIZER INC.**

May 16, 2007 – Philadelphia - A Philadelphia jury held Pfizer Inc. (NYSE:PFE) failed to properly warn New Jersey plaintiff Merle Simon of the breast cancer risk of its hormone replacement therapy drug Provera. Pfizer was ordered to pay \$1.5 million in damages. This was the first hormone therapy case in the nation to involve Pfizer, and the jurors found that the warnings on breast cancer in Provera were inadequate.

Merle and Stephen Simon of West Orange, NJ brought the case seeking to hold responsible both Wyeth Pharmaceuticals (NYSE:WYE) and Pfizer for their insufficient labels on their hormone therapy products Premarin, Prempro (Wyeth) and Provera (Pfizer). James A. Morris, Jr. and Brian Ketterer, of the Philadelphia offices of Brent Coon & Associates, a national law firm headquartered in Beaumont, Texas, represented the Simons in this trial against Wyeth and Pfizer.

Both plaintiffs sat in the courtroom every day for the four weeks of trial. Mrs. Simon took hormone replacement therapy from 1992-2002 and discontinued use of the drugs when she was diagnosed with breast cancer in 2002. While Wyeth escaped liability, the Simons were pleased the jury recognized that Pfizer's negligent conduct and inadequate warnings.

Mr. Morris stated, "We believe this verdict is a good one and the jury's verdict confirms our thoughts all along. While we are disappointed about the verdict with regards to Wyeth, the jury may have felt differently had we been able to present all of our evidence against Wyeth. However, we believe this is an incredibly important verdict for women's health. We remain committed to continuing to try these cases."

This is the third case to go to trial in Philadelphia. In the first two cases, Pfizer was not a defendant, and Wyeth was found liable in both cases.
